NOTES TO CONTRIBUTORS

- 1. The first page of the manuscript should be submitted as a separate document and must include the title of the paper, the author's full name, institutional affiliation, email address, and telephone number.
- 2. Keywords should not exceed four (4) words.
- 3. Manuscripts should be submitted in Microsoft Word format.
- 4. Manuscripts must be formatted using Times New Roman font, size 12, with double line spacing throughout.
- 5. All references must strictly adhere to the APA 6th edition referencing style.
- 6. Authors are responsible for ensuring that their manuscripts conform to the journal's style and formatting guidelines.
- 7. The editorial team will not undertake retyping or extensive formatting of manuscripts before publication.
- 8. Manuscripts should not exceed 15 pages, including references.
- 9. Authors are requested to submit their abstracts online to: educationalfoundations@unn.edu.ng
- 10. Final decisions regarding the manuscripts, along with reviewers' comments, will be communicated to the corresponding author.

PAPER SELECTION PROCESS

- 1. Upon receipt of a manuscript, an acknowledgment email will be sent to the corresponding author immediately.
- 2. The peer-review process may take up to four (4) weeks.
- 3. After the peer-review process, the editorial board will notify the corresponding author of the manuscript's acceptance or rejection. The notification will include any necessary revisions and the anticipated publication date.
- 4. Authors are strongly advised to thoroughly edit and proofread their manuscripts before submission.
- 5. Once the re-edited manuscript is submitted, a confirmation email will be sent to the corresponding author.
- 6. After publication, authors can download the e-journal from the journal's webpage. Hard copies are available upon request.
