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NOTES TO CONTRIBUTORS

1. The first page of the manuscript should be submitted as a separate document and must include the title of the paper, the author's full name, institutional affiliation, email address, and telephone number.
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3. Manuscripts should be submitted in Microsoft Word format.
4. Manuscripts must be formatted using Times New Roman font, size 12, with double line spacing throughout.
5. All references must strictly adhere to the APA 6th edition referencing style.
6. Authors are responsible for ensuring that their manuscripts conform to the journal's style and formatting guidelines.
7. The editorial team will not undertake retyping or extensive formatting of manuscripts before publication.
8. Manuscripts should not exceed 15 pages, including references.
9. Authors are requested to submit their abstracts online to: educationalfoundations@unn.edu.ng
10. Final decisions regarding the manuscripts, along with reviewers' comments, will be communicated to the corresponding author.

PAPER SELECTION PROCESS

1. Upon receipt of a manuscript, an acknowledgment email will be sent to the corresponding author immediately.
2. The peer-review process may take up to four (4) weeks.
3. After the peer-review process, the editorial board will notify the corresponding author of the manuscript's acceptance or rejection. The notification will include any necessary revisions and the anticipated publication date.
4. Authors are strongly advised to thoroughly edit and proofread their manuscripts before submission.
5. Once the re-edited manuscript is submitted, a confirmation email will be sent to the corresponding author.
6. After publication, authors can download the e-journal from the journal's webpage. Hard copies are available upon request.
